	<b>Lesson outline</b>	<p>We will watch the climax of the story and use a range of activities to help us generate vocabulary, ready for planning and writing. We will practise writing full sentences.</p>	<p>We will be investigating the -ity and -ness suffixes and set spelling words to learn.</p>	<p>We will explore using 'As' adverbial complex sentences and complex sentences that have relative clauses in them.</p> <p>We will practise writing sentences throughout the lesson.</p>	<p>We will watch the climax of the story and reflect on our vocabulary lesson before planning each section of the climax in parts. We will practise full sentences out loud.</p>	<p>We will watch the clip again, reflect on our vocabulary choices from our planning lesson and use them to write the climax in short parts. We will finish by reading our whole paragraph out loud.</p>
	<b>Extra Notes</b>	<p>Make sure you have paper or workbook.</p> <p>Match the sentence to its sentence type. Recap what happens in the story thinking about a story mountain. Watch the short clip thinking about the key questions. Make notes if you need to. Draw your sketch and set up your page like the video.</p>	<p>Look at the abstract nouns, proper nouns and common nouns. Listen carefully to the different rules when applying different suffixes. When doing this week's spellings please remember to use them in a sentence.</p>	<p>Make sure you have paper or workbook and your plan from Monday's lesson. Look at how you can use relative clauses to give more information about the picture. Use the sentence stems to help you when completing your full sentence.</p>	<p>Make sure you have paper or workbook. Identify the phrases and clauses within in the text. Rewrite the sentences using a main clause at the beginning instead of the subordinate. Look at different sentences and decide what is the same/different.</p>	<p>You will need your vocabulary notes from the previous lessons. Match the relative clause to the correct sentences. Recap what happens in the story and order the main parts of the climax. Use your notes to help you with the key moments of the climax. You can MAGPIE some ideas but remember this is your writing.</p>
